**H1N1 Vaccination Clinics
Extension of clinic schedule for all Okaloosa County residents**

OKALOOSA COUNTY – The Okaloosa County Health Department has added nearly 25 more days to their H1N1 vaccination clinic schedule. The H1N1 vaccine will continue to be available at no charge for the general public at the Health Department.

Health experts warn that another wave of H1N1 flu after the holidays or late winter is highly possible. Vaccination is recommended for everyone. Persons, who think they or their child has already had the H1N1 flu, are also encouraged to get the vaccine. Dr. Karen Chapman, Director of the Okaloosa County Health Department, encourages Okaloosa residents to take advantage of the added H1N1 vaccination clinics. “A vaccination is the most important step in getting protection against the H1N1 virus.”

The clinics will continue being held at both locations of the health department (Ft Walton Beach and Crestview.) Added dates are as follows:

Monday	Dec 21, 28, Jan 4, 11, 25	8:00 AM - 4:00 PM
Tuesday	Dec 22, 29, Jan 5, 12, 19, 26	8:00 AM - 5:30 PM
Wednesday	Dec 23, 30, Jan 6, 13, 20, 27	8:00 AM - 4:00 PM
Thursday	Dec 31, Jan 7, 14, 21, 28	8:00 AM - 4:00 PM
Friday	Jan 8, 22, 29	8:00 AM - 2:30 PM

As a reminder, children 6 months through 9 years old who have already received one dose of the H1N1 vaccine will need a second dose no earlier than 21 days after the first dose.
